

# FALL TERM '71 CLASS SCHEDULE

ADMISSION

Students who wish to register for 8 or more credit hours must file with the Admissions Office (1) an Application for Admission, and (2) an official copy of high school transcript or official transcripts of all college work. When the required application and transcripts have been received, the applicant will receive a letter of acceptance. One week is required for processing newly admitted students before they may register. To register for 7 or fewer credit hours, no formal application is necessary until 30 hours have been accumulated.

REGISTRATION

Registration is on a first-come first-served basis, so early registration is advisable to assure a wide selection of classes. Students enrolling for 8 or more credit hours must pre-register from July 12 through September 24, between 1:00 and 5:00 p.m., in order to avoid paying the late fee of \$1.00 per day. Last day for these students to register is October 1.

Part-time students enrolling for 7 or fewer credit hours may pre-register from July 12 through September 24 from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., or during the first two weeks of class between 1:00 and 5:00 p.m. A \$1.00 late fee is charged for part-time registration during the third week of classes.

During the first week of classes the registration office is open on Monday through Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. in addition to the regular daytime hours.

During the pre-registration period, morning and evening registration is by appointment only.

COUNSELING

The following students are required to have counselor approval of their programs: new students registering for 8 or more credit hours; students being sponsored by a special program, such as MDTA, DVR, WIN, etc.; students on probation or in danger of failure; students changing their major or those who have questions regarding their major. In addition, any student who wishes counseling assistance in planning his program is encouraged to contact the counseling office.

FINANCIAL AIDS

Students who will need financial assistance in the form of a grant, loan, or campus employment should contact the Financial Aids Office as soon as possible. Applicants for financial aids are judged on (1) financial need, (2) date of application, and (3) aptitude based on interest and past performance.

PASS/NO PASS OPTION

In Spring 1971 the Admissions and Grade Standards Committee and the President's Council approved a new program concerning pass/no pass grading. Certain courses listed in the schedule have an "OPT" designation in the last column, indicating that each student has the option of taking the course for the usual A, B, C, D or F grade or taking it on a pass/no pass basis. On these courses, a check in the last column on the registration form indicates the student wishes to choose the pass/no pass option. Those courses designated "ALL" in the last column of the schedule are graded entirely on the pass/no pass basis and no regular letter grades are assigned. All other classes are graded A, B, C, D or F. The maximum number of "P" (pass) credits allowed toward an LBCC degree will be 16 hours, not including those with mandatory pass/no pass grading. Students should consult with a counselor before deciding to choose the pass/no pass grade. It is not advisable for a student to choose the P/NP grade in a course that is considered a major course in his field of study. Students planning to transfer to a four-year institution should check that institution's requirements regarding the P/NP.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

These are the steps to be taken before you stand in line to register:

1. Complete all admission requirements (see ADMISSION section).
2. Secure counselor approval of your program where required (see COUNSELING section).
3. Pick up a registration packet in the registration area and fully complete each form in ballpoint pen. Make sure all copies are legible. Check posted schedule or Schedule Supplement sheet for filled, cancelled, added or corrected classes.
4. Hospitalization and accident insurance is now available to all students, full- or part-time, at the time of registration or any time prior to the first day of classes. Brochures giving details of this coverage are available in the registration area. Application card is included in the registration packet.
5. Full tuition payment must be made at the time of registration, plus insurance premium if insurance is desired at that time. Students sponsored by one of the special programs must pick up an authorization form at the Financial Aids Office on the west end of the Student Personnel Services Building prior to registering. There is a Deferred Payment Plan which allows a full-time student (12 or more hours) to pay 1/3 of his tuition at the time of registration and the balance of 2/3 by the end of the third week of classes. However, application for a Deferred Payment must be made at the Financial Aids Office prior to registration, and a Deferred Payment Agreement presented at the time of registration.
6. Students attending under the GI Bill, Veteran's Vocational Rehabilitation, Veteran's Dependent, and Social Security have the responsibility of initiating the necessary paper work each term in order to receive these benefits. Be sure to complete the form in the registration packet and carefully follow the printed instructions. Contact the Financial Aids Office if you have any questions.
7. If you were previously allowed to register as a "special" student because your transcripts had not been received, you will not be allowed to re-register until this requirement is met. If you have an outstanding debt with the college from a previous quarter, you must contact the Financial Aids Office to discuss payment prior to registration.

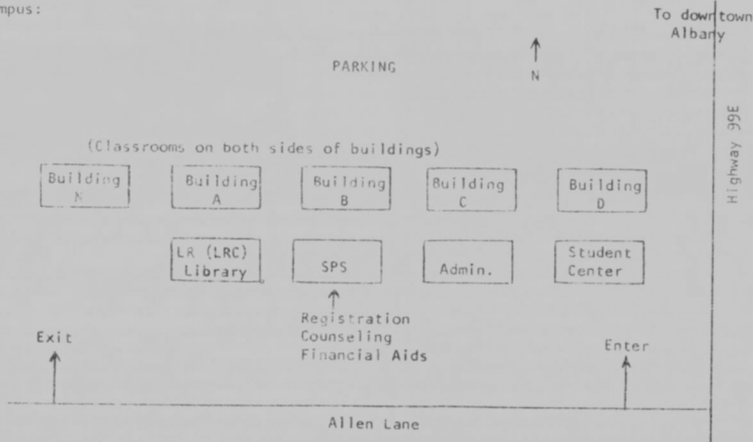
