## **Learning Outcomes:**


Upon completion of this class, the student will be able to:

## **Additional Policies:**


You should meet with your instructor during the first week of class if:

### **Written Reflection Papers:**

A written reflection paper should be no less than 600 words and will assigned after viewing various videos throughtout the quarter. There will be a separate handout for the criteria of each written reflection.

### Research Paper:

The 4 page minimum research paper for the winter term will be on a illustrator of your choosing. There is also a separate handout for this paper.

#### **Method of Evaluation:**

The method of evaluation will based upon completion of all assigned projects, a midterm, a final, one research paper on a filmmaker of your choice and a class notebook.

#### **Grading:**

Incomplete grades will require a valid reason.
