COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course covers accounting theory and procedures for governmental and not-for-profit entities, including budgetary and expenditure control. It builds understanding of basic concepts like accountability, financial statements, and transactions such as recording budgets and property taxes.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: Work assignments for this course will include end of chapter questions (true/false, multiple-choice, and short-answer), and end of chapter problems. There is no supporting lab element of this course. Completed assignments must be brought to class by the due date for evaluation and credit. Each assignment will be reviewed in class and your work will be scored by a randomly selected classmate. No credit will be given for late assignments. No homework solutions will be provided or reviewed by the Instructor outside of class. Since this course, Governmental Accounting, is only offered one time each Fall, failure to pass may delay your program pursuits for an additional year.

ATTENDANCE: Attendance at every class session is an essential element toward earning a passing grade. If you find that you must miss a class session, it is your responsibility to obtain class notes and assignment solutions from another student. The review of homework assignments in class will serve as the reinforcement you need for good performance on the exams.
