COURSE DESCRIPTION

Advances understanding of Photoshop® and Adobe Illustrator® controls.

Students will use both applications for drawing and page layout purposes for art, design and the web. Class work includes filters, styles, automation, modifying paths, placing and importing objects, modifying text, and manipulating layers.

Student projects, a notebook, class discussion, reading and exams will be required to complete the class. Upon completion of this course students are be ready to take the Adobe Certified Associate Exam for both applications.

COURSE OUTCOMES

Use Illustrator to create original vector artwork.

Manipulate and create multi-artboard documents in Illustrator.

Convert scanned images or sketches into vector artwork.

Use actions and automation in Photoshop.

Create and edit animations in Photoshop.

Build complex original art in Photoshop.

Identify file types and file size management.


