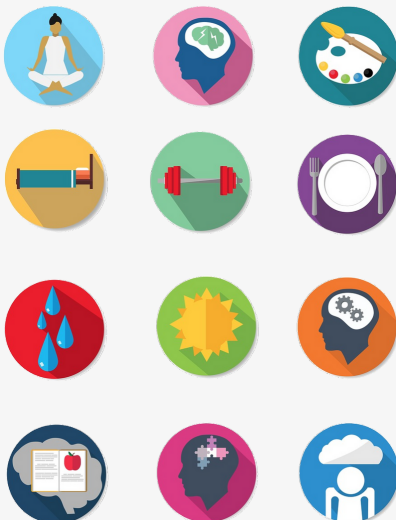
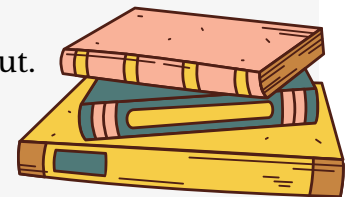


## RETURNS

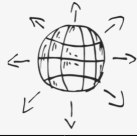
Library personnel will be available from 9:00AM to 3:00PM to receive books, laptops, and other equipment that need to be returned on the last week of Spring term, Monday - Friday June 8-12, and the week after - Monday-Friday, June 15-19. During this time ...

- Please return laptops, chargers, and wireless hotspots directly to Library personnel. There will be a table set up just inside the Library entrance for you to drop devices off. Make sure to receive verbal acknowledgement from us before you leave.

# CHECKOUT THE TECH



When the college closed due to COVID, many students were faced with a loss of computer and internet access, while at the same time adapting to a remote learning system that demanded higher technological capability. There were students with cell phones but no laptops, limited phone data, computers with no webcam or microphone, old computers incompatible with school software, and a host of other problems. So as the main provider of student laptops, the library delivered. Literally. Several library staff delivered laptops, Chromebooks, and hotspots with term-long checkouts to locations in Sweet Home, Lebanon, Albany, and Corvallis so students could complete schoolwork. Almost 95 individual students were served, and while most activity was at the beginning of term, emergencies have cropped up for students throughout the Spring.

Now the library is gearing up to collect items and redistribute them for Summer Term. If you have students in need of a computer and internet access to complete their schoolwork, contact us. If we are not able to meet their needs, we will help them connect with the Roadrunner Resource Center.

Providing laptops for long-term checkout this Spring emptied our regular laptop pool, and we had to give out a few slow old clunkers with no webcam. Luckily, a generous legacy gift of ten laptops from the 2019-2020 Student Leadership Council team will be added to our collection and we are very excited! The outgoing SLC wanted to show their commitment to helping current and future LBCC students. "We hope it is a lasting legacy of our work for LBCC and the students we happily represented," says Student Ambassador and SLC team member Jonathon Media. Thank you SLC! The library has ordered the laptops and is hoping to have them ready to go by Summer Term.
