#### About the class

¡Bienvenidos a la clase de español! Congratulations on taking the first step towards becoming a Spanish speaker!!! To facilitate your Spanish language acquisition, I will provide you with fun, practical, communication-based group activities that will enable you to use the language as much as possible in class. This type of learning environment relies on creating a classroom community that is respectful, positive, and willing to work together to achieve our goal of learning Spanish. To achieve this goal, it is also essential that we try to immerse ourselves in a Spanish-speaking environment and to be aware that class time only does not provide you with enough time to fully absorb all the material. Therefore, if you want to be successful in this class you should prepare to study often. Learning a language requires a lot of exposure so at the very minimum prepare to spend two hours of study for every hour of class.

#### Classroom requirements for all students and faculty due to COVID-19

Linn-Benton Community College has established rules and policies to make the return to the classroom as safe as possible. It is required for everyone to follow all of the campus rules and policies. To participate in this class, LBCC requires all students to comply with the following:

- 3) Empathize with speakers of other languages.
- 4) Explore the history and culture of a variety of Spanish-speaking countries such as Spain, Ecuador, Mexico, and Puerto Rico.

I will accept homework assignments up to one week late for half credit. You have up to seven attempts to get as many points as possible for your homework (only the best attempt counts for calculating your grade).

### **Exams**

There will be four in-class exams. I will post study guides prior to each exam in Moodle. If you are unable to attend class for a **MAJOR REASON**, the day of an exam you must notify me (leave a telephone message or e-mail me) **BEFORE THE EXAM** and we can make arrangements for you to take it at a different time.

#### **Composiciones**

You will write three short essays throughout this course, which will give you the chance to practice the language learned in class. These assignments will be posted and submitted in Moodle.

It is no way acceptable to use an electronic translator for any portion of this assignment. If you do so, you will automatically receive a zero.

- Be realistic about your expectations: No one learns to speak a language in one or two school terms. Acquiring proficiency in a foreign language takes a lot of time and hard work.
- Because not everyone learns the same way it is important that you discover your own and personal learning style.
- Remember it is better to study for short periods of time every day rather than a long time once a week!
