What to expect

¡Bienvenidos! Welcome to SPN 101! This is a beginner class. If you have had Spanish classes before, you may want to take the placement exam at the Learning Center or request it at by email to onlinecpt@linnbenton.edu. Include name and student ID number in all email correspondence. If you prefer to just take SPN 101 to refresh, that is okay too.

Our class is virtual. This means that we will use **Zoom** to have synchronic sessions at the time of our class (1:00 to 2:50 am). If you cannot attend regularly, it is not a good idea to enroll in this class (you would be missing all the

points for participation). However, if you have an emergency and you must miss an occasional class, recordings of our sessions will be available. This would not substitute all your participation but will help you to stay on target. You can also recover participation points for a few classes (please, read the info under "Participation" below).

Basic keys to success in the class

Allow <u>at least</u> 8 hours per week for studying and doing homework in addition to our Zoom sessions. Working on Spanish every single day twice for 45 minutes is a much better way to learn that a 4-hour marathon twice a week. Cramming doesn't work for language classes!

- 1) **Be disciplined!** Start by memorizing all the vocabulary (you can start by making flash cards before we begin any chapter and using them to study regularly).
- 2) Complete your homework every day. Ask for help if you need it. I have office hours to help you, and **LBCC** has Spanish tutors through the **Learning Center**.
- 3) Try to speak Spanish as much as you can: practice with a friend on facetime (or WhatsApp, or any app you like), teach the Spanish you learn to your family, make *Zoom* study sessions with your classmates, and talk to yourself <u>out loud</u>.

General Objectives and Outcomes

In SPN 101 you will learn basic Spanish language structures that will allow you to communicate and understand simple information. At the end of this course, you will be able to...

- ✓ Communicate and demonstrate an understanding of personal information in oral and written form.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the meaning and history of the terms Latino, Hispanic, and Latin.

Additional learning objectives:

- ✓ Learn the basics of Spanish pronunciation and acquire a basic vocabulary to communicate personal info.
- ✓ Empathize with speakers of other languages and explore the history & cultures from Hispanic countries.

- 1) <u>Moodle</u> This is the place to go for everything related to the class, like detailed instructions of what you have to do, study guides, links to Zoom, recordings, etc.
- 2) MindTap This is the website where your textbook lives. If you don't opt out, you can access all materials directly from Moodle. All the homework is assigned on MindTap. There is homework almost every day of the week, so you will have to access MindTap constantly.
- 3) QUIA 101 Come here to practice with games and activities. This is also the website where you take all your tests.


Exámenes y pruebas

We will have a test at the end of each chapter and a final exam. The dates are in the calendar at the end of this document. Tests will be taken online during class time, while you are connected to Zoom and with the video on.

Tareas (homework)

We learn a language through practice, and homework gives you that practice. Completing it on time is key to your success. Additionally, you will have several attempts to submit activities, which allows you to have more control over your grade, and practice until you fully understand the topic. There is homework for almost every day of the week (to distribute your practice evenly through the week), but you can always work ahead if you want a day off.

All homework is assigned online through MindTap. Once you log in, click on *Assignment Calendar* (top of menu). Assigned activities have a DUE DATE next to them. Homework turned in up to two days late receives half credit (no credit after that).



Participación

I understand that things happen that may prevent you from attending our class via Zoom.

- → You may miss up to two classes without this affecting your participation grade but remember to catch up and study on your own all the material covered (there will be recordings available to help you). In addition to those 2 classes, you may miss up to 3 other classes and complete make-up activities for those.
- → Just logging in for the Zoom sessions does not equal participation.

To participate you must come prepared (for example, memorize the vocabulary before the class) and volunteer, answer my questions, ask if something is not clear, and engage actively when we are working in smaller groups. Look for the link to our Zoom sessions and the participation code in Moodle.

Composiciones

Writing is an important part of the learning experience. <u>The objective of the composiciones is that you use what we have learned.</u> Looking up grammar and vocabulary that we have not learned in class will lower your grade for these assignments.

Each one of our compositions consist of a borrador (first draft) and a corrección. Each one is worth 50 points.

Write your borrador and correcciones on Google docs.

- ✓ Use ONLY the vocabulary & grammar we have learned in class. Using other grammar hurts your grade.
- √ You can use online dictionaries, but NEVER look up more than one word at a time. (It's is considered cheating).
- ✓ Underline any word you look up. The maximum number you can use is 8 new words.
- ✓ NEVER use electronic translators.

Entrevistas

We will have a 1-1 interview with me in Spanish twice this term. You will receive a list of questions to help you prepare and I will provide more information when we get closer to them. The dates are in the calendar at the end of this document.

Additional tips for Success in this class

- o Connect with other students taking the class! Meet with them online "for coffee" and chat in Spanish.
- Be realistic about your expectations: No one learns to speak a language in one school term. Acquiring proficiency in a foreign language requires a lot of hard work, so motivation is very important!
- Not everyone learns the same way, so it is important that you discover your own learning style.
- At the very minimum, spend at least 2 hours of study for every credit hour of class. (4 contact hours + 8 hours to study each week).

Make Spanish part of your life and learn faster!

The resources to practice and use Spanish are unlimited. You can hear and read Spanish basically everywhere. Here are some ideas to make Spanish part of your everyday life:

- ✓ Download a few free apps to your phone so you can practice Spanish whenever you have two minutes!

 Duolingo seems to be a favorite
- ✓ Download the MindTap app (it allows you to send homework from your phone).
- Explore Netflix, Hulu. YouTube or any other channel that broadcasts shows and movies in Spanish.
- Meet friends (online) who speak the language! A couple of pages where you can meet native speakers from around the world are **BUSUU** and **CONVERSIFY**. Both platforms connect you with native language speakers that can help you get better, but in exchange you will help someone who is learning English (or another language, if English is not your first language).
