COURSE DESCRIPTION: Relates theory to practical problems in analysis and control of material, labor and overhead costs in manufacturing. Emphasizes the job cost system. Prerequisites: BA 120 Professional Accounting I or BA 211 Principles of Accounting: Financial with a C or better.

HOMEWORK: Exercises and problems at the end of each chapter will be assigned as homework. All homework assignments will be completed via McGraw-Hill's CONNECT. The CONNECT website provides students with built in templates, tutorials, opportunities for practice, and assessment via online quizzes. **Your homework must be completed before the start of each following class, one hour before the start of class on the respective due dates set in CONNECT to receive credit. Late homework will not be accepted for credit.**

QUIZZES AND EXAMS: There is a required quiz following each chapter's homework. There will be 4 exams. If you find that you will have to miss an exam, please make arrangements AHEAD OF TIME to make up the exam. **If a student misses an exam and has not made prior arrangements to make it up, the exam grade will be reduced 20% (late penalty).** Exams must be made up **within one week** of the test date. After that, the student will forfeit the exam. Exceptions may be made for emergency situations.
