Course Outcomes:

• Students will understand basic farrier science, and be able to communicate effectively with a professional farrier to discuss individual horse needs.

- Students will understand how ingrained equine behavior may affect training and management techniques.
- Students will learn the theory of basic training skills to effectively utilize ingrained behavior to maximize interactions with horses.
- Students will be introduced to the theory of effectively managing a facility, including manure, equipment, pasture and arena management, and client communication.

Grading:

There will be 3 quizzes, 1 midterm, a term project, and a cumulative final exam for this class. If you miss a quiz without letting me know in advance you will not be able to make it up. You must let me know if you cannot make it to the midterm BEFORE the day of the midterm if you would like to make it up. You will have until the next class period to make up either the midterm or quizzes.

Final grades will be loosely defined as the following: >90% = A; 80% = B; 70% = C; 60% = D; <60% = F

Incomplete Grades: An incomplete (I) may be given if the student completes the majority of the coursework, but for some VALID reason misses a portion of the course. Before an "I" is given the student and the instructor must agree on when the work will be completed. If the student does not complete the work they may receive a letter grade for the course.

Quizzes: There will be 2 quizzes, given remotely on Moodle. They will be open book and open note exams. There will be a time limit on the quiz, and you will have one opportunity to take and

complete the exam. The quizzes will be open for 3 days.

Midterm and Final: There will be a 100 point midterm, and a 100 point (non-cumulative) final exam given remotely on Moodle. These exams will be open for 3 days.

Homework: Homework is given weekly, except week 5 and 10. It is due the Sunday of the week it is assigned by midnight. So, for example, week 1 homework is due Sunday, October 4th.

Project: There is a 50 point project due week 10. You can find a link to the project description on the moodle page.
