SUMMER TERM 1971 CLASS SCHEDULE

Summer Term 1971 is the first quarter of LBCC's new "year-round" college operation. A student can plan a summer quarter at LBCC the same as he would plan any other quarter. LBCC will offer COMPACT three- and five-week courses in addition to the regular ten-week courses. Registration for the COMPACT courses can be completed either during the pre-registration period or during the first three days of each segment. It will be possible for a student to complete a 30-week sequence of courses in a nine-week period.

ADMISSION

Students who wish to register for a total of 8 or more credit hours during summer term must file with the Admissions Office (1) an Application for Admission, and (2) an official copy of high school transcript or official transcripts of all college work. When a student has provided the college with the required application and transcripts, the applicant will receive a letter of acceptance.

REGISTRATION

Students enrolling for 8 or more credit hours must pre-register from June 14 to 18, between 1:00 and 5:00 p.m., to avoid paying a late fee of \$1.00 per day. Last day for these students to register is June 25. Registration for the COMPACT courses may be added during the first three days of each segment.

Part-time students enrolling for 7 or fewer credits may pre-register from June 14 to 18 from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m., or during the first two weeks of class between 1:00 and 5:00 p.m. A \$1.00 late fee will be charged for part-time registration during the third week. Registration for the COMPACT courses may be completed either during the pre-registration period or during the first three days of each segment.

The Registration Office will be open Monday through Thursday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. during the first four days of classes in addition to the regular daytime hours.

COUNSELING

Students who are planning to attend LBCC during the summer term of 1971 may seek counseling assistance in planning their program. The following students are required to have counselor approval: new students taking 8 or more hours; students being sponsored by a special program, such as MDTA, DVR, WIN, etc.; students on probation or in danger of failure; students changing their major or those who have questions regarding their major.

FINANCIAL AIDS

Students who will need financial assistance in the form of a grant, loan, or campus employment should contact the Financial Aids Office. Applicants for financial aids are judged on (1) financial need, (2) date of application, and (3) aptitude based on interest and past performance.
