REQUIRED MATERIALS

Income Tax Fundamentals 2022 Gerald E. Whittenburg; Martha Altus-Buller; Steven Gill 40th Edition (*Includes 2 term CengageNow access code if purchased at bookstore.*) and Cengage online access.

At this time, the text also satisfies part of the required materials for BA 257, if taken Fall 2022.

This course is the first of two courses required to prepare you to take the State of Oregon Tax Preparers' Exam.

COURSE OUTCOMES:

Identify the basic conceptual foundations of United States (Federal) tax law and describe the differences between federal taxation of individuals, corporations, partnerships, and sole proprietors. Explain the gross income concept. Identify itemized deductions and prepare Schedule A, 'Itemized Deductions', and identify business income and expenses for a sole proprietor and prepare Schedule C, Profit or Loss from Business (Sole Proprietorship). Prepare a basic individual income tax return, Form 1040, including commonly filed schedules. Identify complex tax situations such as passive losses, tax credits, retirement plans, and fiscal years for referral to a tax advisor.

COURSE DESIGN: Your instructor will present the learning objectives for Chapters 1-6 and CSP introduction via recorded sessions posted in Moodle. Selected exercises at the end of Chapters 1-6 are assigned as **homework** in Cengage.

Live Zoom review sessions TBA.

Cumulative Software Problem assignments are prepared in a tax preparation program made available with your text and are due on the dates listed. The instructor will announce which pages of the returns to turn and how to turn them in.

The Midterm and Final are online in Cengage.

There will be 3 extra credit opportunities worth 10 points each.
